


Marburg at a glance



INTRO



A WARM WELCOME IN MARBURG –

university town with an 800 year history, with small crooked streets and lanes in the old town between the river Lahn and the castle on the hill. University flair set in an impressive surrounding countryside!

An interplay between history, tourism and culture has always been a hallmark of Marburg. As early as the 13th century, when the Deutsche Orden built the first gothic hall-church on German soil to the honour of St Elisabeth this was already the case. The pilgrims from far and wide who visited the Elisabeth church were the earliest tourists.

Landgrave Philipp (the magnanimous!) when he founded the University in 1527 also ensured that Marburg would be a town open to the world with students and visitors from all over the globe.

The first Nobel prize winner for medicine Emil von Behring after whom the pharmaceutical company was named gave Marburg, by his combining of science with business, the impulse to become a centre for meetings and congresses.

History, culture, science and the unique ambience make together the special attractiveness of Marburg. "Marburg at a glance" gives you just a first impression. 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THE WAY UP

From the river Lahn through the old town to the castle: 109 m (340 ft) rise – two lifts to the old town – 400 steps. The brothers Grimm joked that in Marburg there are more steps in the streets than in the houses!




Marburg sights



ELISABETH CHURCH *ELISABETHKIRCHE*

The Elisabeth church is the earliest pure gothic hall church with a triple-apse choir and was completed in less than 50 years from 1235 to 1283 as the Marian church of the „Deutsche Ritter (=Knights) Orden“. Later the Landgraves of Hesse were buried over the tomb of the Holy Elisabeth of Thuringia.


The building is not only impressive – it is also in the history of architecture of great interest. The stained-glass windows depict the life of St. Elisabeth and show her charitable work in some of the finest examples of gothic stained-glass art. The precious stones in the richly decorated golden shrine of the Holy Elisabeth are spectacular.

Today this building is a protestant parish church and a magnificent monument to sacred architectural art which attracts many tens of thousands of visitors each year.

CASTLE OF THE LANDGRAVE *LANDGRAFENSCHLOSS*

The founding residence of the Landgraves of Hesse was built as a crown in the landscape; a fort on a spur, the so-called "Gisonen" rocks above the town. The castle was first begun around 1000 a.d. making it one of the earliest high forts in Germany and was influential in the future development of Marburg.

The Landgrave's castle, princely residence and fort. Gothic and late gothic with renaissance additions it is a unique building with a multi-faceted history. This can be seen for example in the castle defence ditch and park where the casemates are to be found. An important part of the castle today belongs to the university and houses the Museum of Cultural History including the prehistory and early history of Hesse, religious art and civic life. In summer in addition to the beautiful "Schlosspark", a wonderful rose garden there are

events such as the "Three Days Marburg" culture festival and for the evenings an open-air cinema is a magnet both for residents and visitors. Castle tours: see page 9 Guided tours for visitors.



PHILIPPS UNIVERSITY *PHILIPPS-UNIVERSITÄT*

The university which was founded in 1527 by the Landgrave Philipp the Magnanimous is the oldest protestant university in the world and with its more than 25.000 students in the faculties of medicine, natural sciences and humanities plays a great role in the life of the town.

The natural sciences and medicine are now almost all situated on the Lahn hills to the east of the town. The humanities and the university library will soon move from their site on "Krummbogen" along the river and motorway to a new campus around the Old Botanical Garden. From 1873 to 1891 the architect Carl Schäfer built the "Old University" in neogothic style on the foundations of a Dominican cloister from the 13th century. In the "Alte Aula" (=old lecture theatre) in the lower photo, can be seen in a large wall painting by Peter Janssen, a unique look into the history of the town of Marburg.



HISTORICAL OLD TOWN

Fascinating narrow lanes, crooked steps, superbly restored half-timbered houses and venerable old churches. The **old town of Marburg (8)** invites you to wander and to spend a little time to appreciate its own special charm. Everywhere you are confronted with clues and evidences which document the lives of the great who lived here. Such figures as the Brothers Grimm, Martin Luther and the Nobel prize winner Emil von Behring all left their mark.

On the **central market-place (4)** is the late gothic **town hall (9)** from the early 16th century which is today just as it always was, the centre of a pulsating civic life. For over 400 years one could see and hear every full hour the same amusing spectacle. From the renaissance gable on the roof of the town hall an old cockerel flaps his (somewhat lame!) wings to the accompaniment of harsh, tinny trumpet blasts.

The churches of the old town are places of quiet and stillness in the middle of busy urban surroundings:

In the gothic **Lutherian Parish church of St. Mary (10)**. This is the oldest parish church in Marburg with its characteristic-

ally leaning steeple (Lutherischer Kirchhof 1, Tel.: +49 (0)6421 / 3400695, Mo - Sun 8 am - 6 pm).

Or in the **University Church (11)** from the beginning of the 14th century, a half a millennium older than the neogothic **Old University (7)** built on to it at the foot of the old own (Reitgasse, Tel.: +49 (0)6421 / 23745).

And in the **Kugelkirche (=ball church) (12)** from the early 16th century and named after the „Kugelherren“ who wore a ball-like head covering (Kugelgasse 8, Tel.: +49 (0)6421 / 913910, Mo - Fri 8 am - 6 pm, Sat & Sun 10 am - 6 pm).

14 | The Old Botanical Garden



WELL WORTH SEEING!

48 | The Collegiate Church of St John the Baptist in Amöneburg

The church, built on this basalt stump, is visible from far away, and towers over the roofs of the historical old town of Amöneburg. The renovated Collegiate Church is from the 18th century. From this site the holy Bonifacius (the Apostle of the Germans) in 721 began his missionary activities in upper Hesse. Opposite the remains of the old fort are still to be seen. 49 | Brücker Mühle in Amöneburg

The Brücker Mühle is a living cultural and industrial monument where grain has been milled since 1248. The mill can be driven by its own water-powered generator and by arrangement can be visited. 50 | Zeitinsel (= Time Island) Niederweimar

Since about 1990 archaeological relics have been found here near to the gravelworks of Niederweimar. The remains of medieval and late medieval settlements were discovered here. On this site an open-air archaeological museum, the "Zeitinsel" has been in existence since 2010. Various plant communities were established on a 3.5 hectare, landscaped site and surround the different locations of interest on this 'Time Island'.

51 | The Otto Ubbelohde House and Garden in Goßfelden

Here can be found the living house and the studio of the Hesse landscape painter and graphic artist Otto Ubbelohde (1867 - 1922). He became well known for his illustrations for the fairytales and legends recorded by the Brothers Grimm. His studio, which is in the original condition, has not only a permanent exhibition of his work but also regularly changing exhibitions of his drawings.

54 | Sculpture Path and Nature Adventure, Erlensee in Kirchhain

The sculpture path connects the town of Kirchhain to the protected nature site: the Erlensee. The path, about 2 km long goes through the traffic-free zone of the town into the romantic little village. In the Anna park it crosses the historical garden (designed by the Bothers Sysmeier) which forms part of the Garden Route Eder-Lahn-Diemel. The sculpture path will be extended by a connection to the paper mill and paper garden and also to the nine watch towers on the river Worra. Various information boards, an acoustic info-station, a guide and information system for the blind and visually handicapped allow you to experience the nature site Erlensee with all your senses. Acoustic station opening times: April - October, 1 pm - 4 pm and by arrangement.

55 | Schweinsberg Castle or Fort and the Schweinsberg Fen

At the edge of the Amöneburg Basin the Fort (built 1231 - 1234) Schweinsberg is to be found. Of the original fort courtyard buildings only the cellars and some ruins of walls have survived along with the so-called "Fahnrichbau" (1530 - 1532) a signal tower. The fort is privately owned and therefore not open to the public. The fen which is a protected nature reserve, which has developed over last 10,000 years since the time of the last ice-age, is over 43 hectare in area and has a unique flora and fauna. A part of the fen has been modified to form an area of open water to provide an environment for water birds. In the fen are living and breeding many rare species of birds and it also forms an ideal habitat for wild boar, foxes and deer. Guided tours by arrangement

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

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
